Mr. Davis retired from the US Army in 2015 after more than 20 years of active service. Most recently he served as the Executive Officer for the Asia-Pacific Regional Center at the Defense Intelligence Agency. He served additional assignments as an Asia-Pacific regional analyst on the Joint Staff, Pentagon and brief stints, separately, as a cross-Strait analyst and a People's Liberation Army military capabilities analyst.

Further assignments and adventures while on active duty sent Mr. Davis through Paraguay and Brazil as well as large portions of Asia to include living in the Republic of Korea and, later, in the People's Republic of China. A few years in between were spent teaching Calculus and Statistics at the US Military Academy - which was followed with a rotation in Afghanistan as a Provincial Reconstruction Team operations officer.

Mr. Davis is in the process of completing his dissertation at George Mason University in Political Science. He holds three Master of Science degrees (International Relations, Applied Mathematics and Scientific Computation, and International Management). He earned his Bachelor of Science degree in mathematics from the US Military Academy at West Point in 1997; and also obtained two Associate of Arts degrees from the Defense Language Institute (Spanish and Mandarin).
