KATO Yoichi is a special fellow at the Waseda Institute of Asia-Pacific Studies (WIAPS) in Japan and an adjunct fellow with the Japan Chair at the Center for Strategic and International Studies (CSIS) in Washington, D.C. He recently completed a project on Japan-U.S.-Taiwan defense cooperation at the Institute for National Defense and Security Research (INDSR) in Taiwan and maintains his affiliation with the institute. He is a political reporter by training and worked for the Asahi Shimbun, a Japanese newspaper, for more than three decades until 2015. He has served as bureau chief of Asahi's American General Bureau in Washington, D.C., and as national security correspondent in Tokyo. While at the Asahi Shimbun, he held researching positions, including visiting scholar at the School of International Studies of Peking University in Beijing, and visiting research fellow at both CSIS and the Institute for National Strategic Studies of the National Defense University (INSS/NDU) in Washington, D.C. He holds an MA from the Fletcher School at Tufts University.
