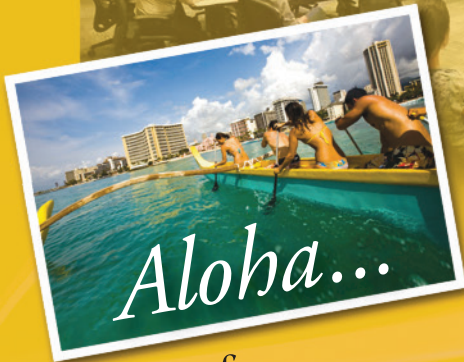

annual convention will occur in Honolulu, Hawaii this June, and she plans to visit DKI APCSS during her stay.

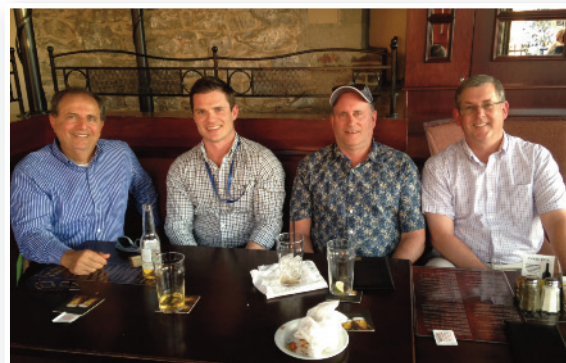


DKI APCSS Professor, Dr. Rouben Azizian, traveled to Ottawa, Canada
