As the Special Assistant for Plans and Strategy at the Defense Institute of International Legal Studies (DIILS), Jeff's responsibilities include advising the director and oversight of strategic planning and outreach for a \$12M global security cooperation program that conducts over 130 annual educational engagements focused on building the defense legal institutions and capacity of our international partners.

From 1982 to 1989, Jeff served as an intern in the U.S. House of Representatives, a researcher at the Smithsonian Museum of Natural History, and a simultaneous interpreter in support of the Department of State's International Leadership Visitor Program.

Jeff joined the Department of Defense as a civilian in 1989. Prior to joining the DIILS leadership team in April 2010, he served for four years as a program analyst in the Strategy and Programs directorates of the Defense Security Cooperation Agency; four years on the Army Staff as the G-35 Branch Chief for Security Cooperation Strategy and Plans, where, after the 9-11 attacks, he was detailed to the Army Strategic Planning Board to develop national military strategy, and, in 2003, he drafted the Army's first comprehensive Security Cooperation Strategy; five years as the program manager for Army bilateral interoperability programs, including the army-to-army senior staff talks, in the office of the Deputy Under Secretary of the Army for International Affairs; and seven years as a simultaneous interpreter and country desk officer at HQ Army Materiel Command (Office of International Cooperative Programs).

Jeff holds a 2005 Master's Degree from the Army War College and a 1984 B.S. degree and two French translation certificates from Georgetown University. He is a 2001 graduate of the Massachusetts Institute of Technology's Seminar XXI on foreign politics, international relations and the national interest. He is a native of Wellfleet, MA, and lives in Portsmouth, RI. He is fluent in French and Italian, and speaks passable German. He enjoys music, sailing and skiing.

Jeff's personal decorations include the Army Commander's Award for Civilian Service, the Army Achievement Medal for Civilian Service, and the Army Meritorious Civilian Service Award.
