Background

Announced on June 24, 2022, the Partners in the Blue Pacific (PBP) is an informal mechanism strengthening cooperation to support Pacific Island priorities more effectively and efficiently. Initially comprising Australia, Japan, New Zealand, the United Kingdom and the United States, the initiative now includes Canada, Germany and the Republic of Korea. The PBP also strives to coordinate with other active partners in the Pacific, such as the European Union, France, and India.

Significant headway has already been accomplished advancing the PBP. To sustain this, deeper dialogue among Partners and the Pacific Islands will be essential. Such dialogue is particularly crucial for addressing broad ranging and cross-cutting challenges such as IUUF and MDA – both high priorities for the Pacific Islands, with impacts across multiple PBP Lines of Effort. The development – in close consultation with the Pacific Islands – of a more granular shared understanding of these challenges and of what is needed to address them, will be invaluable in guiding an identification and prioritization of potential PBP efforts in these areas and delivering outcomes supporting PBP aspirations.

Workshop Methodology

This 2.5-day workshop brings together senior officials from Partners, the Pacific Islands, the Pacific Islands Forum Secretariat, and other key partner countries for this purpose. The workshop features a series of plenary discussions led by regional subject matter experts deepening shared understanding of the challenges of IUUF and MDA, particularly as they relate to the Pacific Islands, culminating in the identification of potential PBP activities in each area and associated next steps. Supplementing these plenaries are dedicated times for bilateral or multilateral meetings among participants for more in-depth discussion on topics of mutual interest. A final concluding plenary will offer an opportunity for a summation of workshop outcomes together with discussion of the wider PBP way-ahead.

Workshop Outcomes

- Strengthened shared understanding among participants of the IUUF and MDA challenges in the Pacific, and of what is needed to address these.
- Identification and prioritization of a range of PBP efforts addressing the IUUF and MDA challenges, for further discussion, development and implementation.
- Strengthened networks of communication among participants enabling further coordination to meet Pacific MDA and IUUF needs.
