

**Blaire Harms, US Army (Retired) – Regional Program Lead - Oceania**

Blaire Harms is currently a Senior Lecturer and the Oceania Regional Program Lead (RPL) in the Regional Advising Division at the Institute for Security Governance (ISG). ISG is the Institutional Capacity Building Center of Excellence for the Defense Security Cooperation Agency as part of the Defense Security Cooperation University. As the RPL in she is responsible for coordinating, planning and executing institutional capacity building activities in support of country capabilities development and sustainment.
